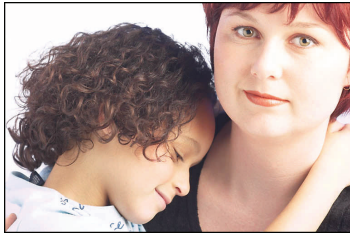

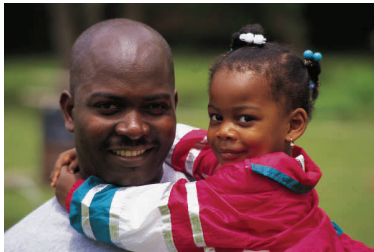

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Volunteer/Intern — answering the hotline, assisting with the children's program, working in the office, accompanying clients to hospital or court

Cash Contributions — to assist clients with transportation, medications and childcare

Donations — paper products, clothing, furniture, toiletries and household items to be used at the shelter as well as general office supplies

SERVICES

All services are provided free of charge

24-Hour Hotline — operated by trained staff and volunteers to provide crisis intervention and information/referral

Emergency Shelter — houses 35 women and children who need a safe place to stay when fleeing family violence and/or sexual assault

Transitional Housing Apartments — provides an extended residence to women and their children as they strive to become self-sufficient and live violence-free lives

Counseling and Support Groups — a vital part of the healing process for survivors

Educational Services — "Project Empowerment" equips youth with information and skills for creating a safer community

Legal Advocacy — help with protective orders and Crime Victims' Compensation

Accompaniment — to hospital, court and law enforcement

Professional Trainings/Community Education — to inform others on the dynamics, effects, and prevention of domestic violence/sexual assault as well as to create a continuum of services
